- Lithuania All children with disabilities go to Special Schools
- Netherlands Inclusion is at the start of its journey
- Portugal Social, cultural and individual inclusion
- Turkey Inclusive opportunities for all children
- UK Well established with lots of frameworks and support


- 1. Does the background of the child influence their development?
